Entrepreneurship Marketing: Mistakes and How to Avoid Them
11/8 | 6:30-7:30 It's ironic: You start your own business because there's something you love doing and do very well, only to find yourself spending most of your time doing something else. Marketing, for example. Between your own lack of marketing experience and, sometimes, vendors more than willing to take advantage of it, you're vulnerable to making mistakes that can cost you money and opportunity while jeopardizing the growth of your business. Voices From the Attic: The Williamstown Boys in the Civil War
11/9 | 6:30-8:00 Join author Carleton Young who discovered an enormous collection of letters written by two soldiers during the Civil War! In his book, *Voices From the Attic: The Williamstown Boys in the Civil War*, he tells the story of two brothers who witnessed and made history by fighting in the Peninsula Campaign, then at South Mountain, Antietam, Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, Gettysburg, Mine Run, the Bristoe Campaign, the Wilderness, Petersburg, and Cedar Creek. Learn more about their surprisingly detailed and insightful letters and Young's own account of solving the mystery of how the letters ended up undisturbed a century and a half later in his parents' attic in Pittsburgh.

Author Presentation: You Are Never Alone by Carolyn Skowron
11/11 | 6:30-7:30 Local young author, Carolyn Skowron will share her story of recovery and discovery from her book, *Ubreakable*. She'll discuss how mental health struggles are increasing in kids ages 13-17 and how finding her voice has helped her find happiness from within. Carolyn's message is that we are never alone and that we must make peace with asking for help. Her goal is to help drive education and conversation around mental health thereby helping end the stigma surrounding it.
